

Spring 2013 Building Day Success!

This past April 20th was this year's Community Garden Building and Beautification Day. There was a lot accomplished this year! The ICG team, along with IUP Students from Into the Streets, Indiana Area School's Key Club, and countless individuals all helped build and fill 10 new beds in the garden. We have doubled in size and are thrilled to report that all individual plots have been rented for this year. There were many other projects going on besides bed building. Gerald ("G") Smith planned and helped execute the installation of a large rain barrel system! The garden now has four rain barrels that will be utilized to water the garden. An educational sign will be posted soon by the new rain barrel system to both guide the use of how to use this water and educate the community on the benefits of rain water for gardening. We also were able to plant 14 apple trees thanks to Bob Pollock and help from volunteers.

One of the bigger projects, which is still being worked on, are the series of screens that will be masking the gas well, which was designed by Adam Criscuola and built by Bill Heberer. Many individuals have been helping this project along. There were a number of individuals who helped Bill on Building Day dig post holes and install the bottoms of the screens, which are made up of lattice. The African American Cultural Center helped varnish the post and lattice work. Marine-grade fabric will be lining the top, like sails, and are in the process of being sewn by Gail Auth. We want to thank Royal Oil & Gas for their donations to the Indiana Community Garden, without which much of these projects wouldn't have been possible.

When visiting the garden, take notice of our three compost bins. Thanks to Charlie Venturella, we have expanded the bins from one to three to help in one of our missions which is Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. Educational signs will be posted by the composting bins so the community as well as plot owners understand how the bins work and more importantly for plot owners, utilize the compost for their own gardens.

Local Kids Getting Involved in the Garden!

This year, many different groups have showed interest in bringing students and children to the garden to help educate them on planting and growing food. A total of 65 kindergarten and first grade students from Horace Mann Elementary School came to the garden a couple of times to plant seeds and plants in the community beds and make labels to help identify what they planted. They got to learn about different garden bugs, how and why to compost, and most importantly (for little children), put earth worms into the community beds! Other groups like Graystone Church's Seeds of Faith Christian Academy students came to learn about all of the wonders of gardening.
